## OUTREACH GRIEF SUPPORT

Good morning, Dear Ones,

We did not ask for, or know, how to anticipate this journey of grief in the wilderness, but Spring brings a time of hope and renewal.

What is this journey? It started with the loss of our husband or wife. It put us in a fog at first, trying to work through the many mixed emotions of shock, panic, numbness, denial, outbursts, anger, fear, etc. We not only lost our loved one but also experienced secondary losses, such as friend, gardener, provider, listener, mechanic, companion, bill payer, lover, tax preparer, confidant, shoulder to cry on, secret sharer or cook. I am sure you can come up with even more secondary losses. Grief is connected to ALL aspects of our life when widowed. Our daily, normal life we had prior to the death completely disappeared leaving us with a new day not knowing who we are or what our purpose is. Then comes isolation and loneliness. This is not necessarily in order, as there is no right way to grieve, just our way and our time. Then, as time (our time) passes, with support, we start to see hope.

How do we get this hope? Through a Surviving Spouse Group such as WPS. We specialize in the grief that only a person who has experienced the death of their spouse is feeling, whether it has been months or years. We provide education and hand-outs about grief and coping, but the main thing you receive is sharing with the experiences of others and finding out "you are not alone." We provide goals for grief healing. These are **not short term** goals; they are **long term** goals. You will not as a griever go through these steps before you are ready to do so. Grief healing is designed to help you better understand the emotions, feelings, and steps in this process. We are here to help you accomplish these goals, **not** force you through them. The choice is yours.

You cannot be given a life by someone else. Of all the people you know in your lifetime, you are the only one you will never leave or lose. To the questions of your life, you are the only answer. To the problems of your life, you are the only solution. Hugs, and see the "total eclipse" this month.

**Get Rid of those clothes that don't fit you anymore or extra household items you don't need, and WPS will receive a donation.**

Donate 2 Impact is a non-profit organization that accepts items for resale and reimburses other charitable organizations for them at a rate of \$0.09 per pound. WPS has signed up with this organization, and they have given us the **donation period of May 13 - 26, 2024.**

Items may be dropped off at the following location: **6020 S. Cooper St. Arlington.** Their hours of operation are Monday – Saturday 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM and Sunday 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM. **Donations must be made during the WPS Donation period for WPS to receive credit.**

When you drop off your items make sure you tell them that your organization is **Widowed Persons Service of Tarrant County (WPS).**

You also have the option to have them pick up your items. You must schedule the pickup between **May 13 - 26, 2024,** and you must have the items outside your house for pickup. Call (972) 619-7880 to schedule a pickup. When you schedule a pickup, they will give you a date that they will pick up. They can schedule up to 2 weeks after the WPS donation period. Again, make sure you tell them that your organization is **Widowed Persons Service of Tarrant County (WPS).** They also request that items be separated as much as possible (i.e, clothing, shoes, appliances) and that breakable items be protected with packing.

**Below is a list of Items that they Accept:**

Clothing (all types and sizes), Shoes, Purses/Backpacks, Jewelry & Accessories, Linens/ blankets, Household items, Bath and Kitchen items, Books, Toys, Electronics, Small Appliances, and Small Home Décor.

**Below is a list of items NOT Accepted:**

Any used Medical Supplies, Anything Toxic or Flammable, Blinds, Building Materials (bricks, lumber, fence posts, tile, etc.), Cabinetry, Chemicals/Oils/Paints, Countertops, Doors, Food (animal or human), Hospital Beds/Adjustable Beds, Hot Tubs, Large Appliances, Large Exercise Equipment – Heavy Dumbbells, Light Fixtures, Magazines, Mattresses/ Box Springs, Newspapers, Office furniture, Cubicles, Desks, File Cabinets, Pipes, Scrap Fabric, Sheet Rock, Sinks, Soiled/Torn/Damaged/Stained Furniture, Swing Sets, Tires, Toilets, Trash, Tube TVs, CRT and Projection TVs, Unframed Mirrors, Unprotected Glasses, Used AC/Heating Units, Water Beds, Water Heaters, Weapons/Guns,/Swords/Knives, Wet/Rusty/Broken Items of any kind, Windows.
